*\*The Early Minyan on the First Day of Chag is in accordance the ruling of Ben Ish Hai, who says that one may pray Mincha-Arvit, light candles and make Kiddush early on Monday night (the second night of Yom Tov). By doing so, the meal will begin while it is still the first day of Yom Tov, thereby making it permissible to light candles and prepare for the meal on Monday during the day. One should light candles and say Kiddush before sunset at 7:50 PM. If one is praying at the later minyan, candle lighting for the second night must be later as well, after 8:19 pm.*

**Counting the Omer** 

As we've just begun counting the Omer, I think it is important to make sure all our Minyanim are consistent with our Minhagim and Halacha. According to **Morenu Rabbi Ben Haim**, the most **ideal** time to count Sefirat Haomer is **15 minutes after sunset** (which is Tzeit Hakochavim). However, if a Minyan finished Arvit a bit early, they may count with a beracha **only after Shekia (sunset)**. This only applies to a Minyan, and not to an individual. Lastly, as per **Morenu Mr. Bassalian**, the Mashadi Minhag is to count the Omer after *Shir Lamaalot* and **before Kaddish Yehe Shelama**. However, Mr. Bassalian explained that if the Minyan ended **before** the earliest time to count the Omer, the entire Minyan should count the Omer after *Alenu*. When counting after *Alenu*, we add another *Kaddish Yehe Shelama* for any mourners. Be'ezrat HaShem our entire community can fulfill the beautiful mitzvah in line with our rich tradition.
